Five Tips on Preparing FPRA Image Award Entries

- 1. Read the directions. Make sure to address all five elements of the summary: Research, Objectives, Implementation, Evaluation and Budget. Don't try to fake any of them. You must provide valid information on each element.
- **2. Track projects throughout the year, not just at awards time.** Keep a file for notes, surveys and documentation. It will make compilation that much easier.
 - Evaluate every project as a potential entry
 - Keep good records
 - Record your objectives
 - Set quantifiable goals
 - Organize your support materials. Include survey results, proof of research, before and after samples, media clips, letters of appreciation, pertinent reference material. Get audio and video files of all radio and television publicity.
- **3. Plan ahead to conduct research and document results.** It will strengthen your work. Manage by fact. Measure your results.
- **4. Put the most work into the summary, not just the notebook.** It is 70% of your total score. Be clear, concise and factual, not just creative.
- 5. Review the checklist provided in the Call for Entries. Be sure all criteria are met.
